SEC. 2. ESTABLISHING GOOD MORAL CHARACTER OF AP PLICANTS FOR CITIZENSHIP WHO SERVED
HONORABLY IN THE ARMED FORCES OF THE
UNITED STATES.

5 Section 328(e) of the Immigration and Nationality 6 Act is amended by adding at the end the following: "Notwithstanding section 101(f), a finding that an applicant 7 8 under this section is described in any of paragraphs (1) 9 through (9) of section 101(f) (except in the case of an 10 applicant who is described in any such paragraph because 11 of having been convicted of an aggravated felony described 12 in subparagraph (A), (I), (K), or (L) of section 101(a)(43)) shall not preclude a finding that the applicant 13 14 is of good moral character. In determining whether the applicant is of good moral character, the applicant's serv-15 ice under honorable conditions shall be weighed against 16 any finding that the applicant is described any such para-17 18 graph.".
